What is Missional Living?

Missional living means living your life on mission with God to bring about reconciliation and transformation in people's lives. This comes through in lots of different ways: through praying for them, sharing the gospel with them, serving them, doing acts of kindness for them, and loving them.

Reflection Questions:

- 1.) Based on today's sermon, how would you describe what "missional living" is?
- 2.) What other "missions" besides the one Jesus has sent you on do you find yourself on often (i.e. make money, be respected, be successful...)?
- 3.) Why, as Christians, are we on mission?

- 4.) What ways have you been “missionally” engaged with the people around you recently?
- 5.) What is the most intimidating or frightening thing for you about being on mission with Jesus?
- 6.) What sins do you need to repent of in order to be more missionally engaged in the world? (i.e. pride, legalism, selfishness, self-righteousness...)
- 7.) How does unbelief keep us off mission? What promises of God help you on the mission he has sent you on?
- 8.) What Scriptures best define the mission and most inspire you on mission?
- 9.) Who are the people God has placed in your life recently that He may want to reconcile and transform through your witness and ministry? Who are some good missional partners that you can be on mission together with?
- 10.) What is your vision for how to live out God’s mission in your typical week? Are there any activities, hobbies, things you do that you may have to cut down on or cut out all together because they are not helpful in the mission God has sent you on? Are there other activities and opportunities for mission that God may be calling you into?
